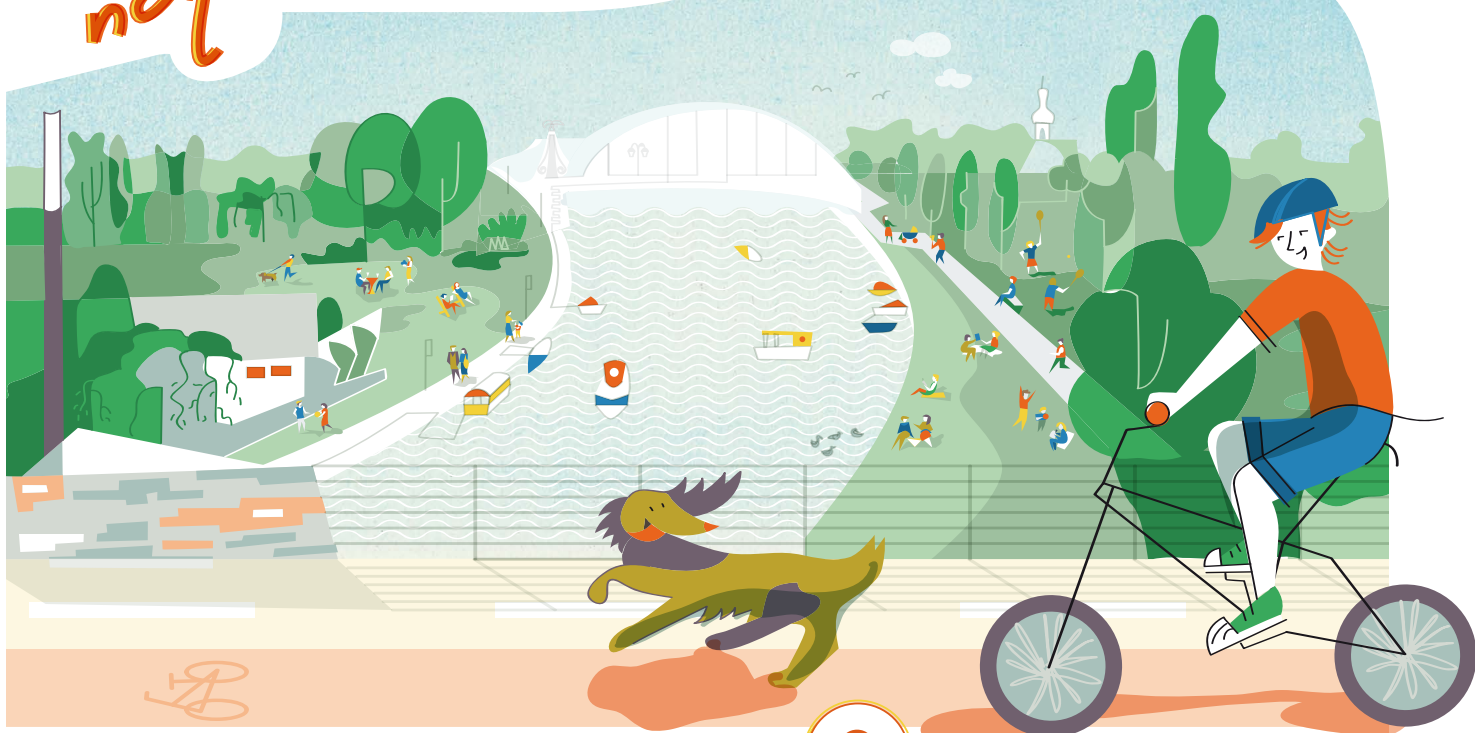
Adam loves swimming but the swimming pools are always packed.

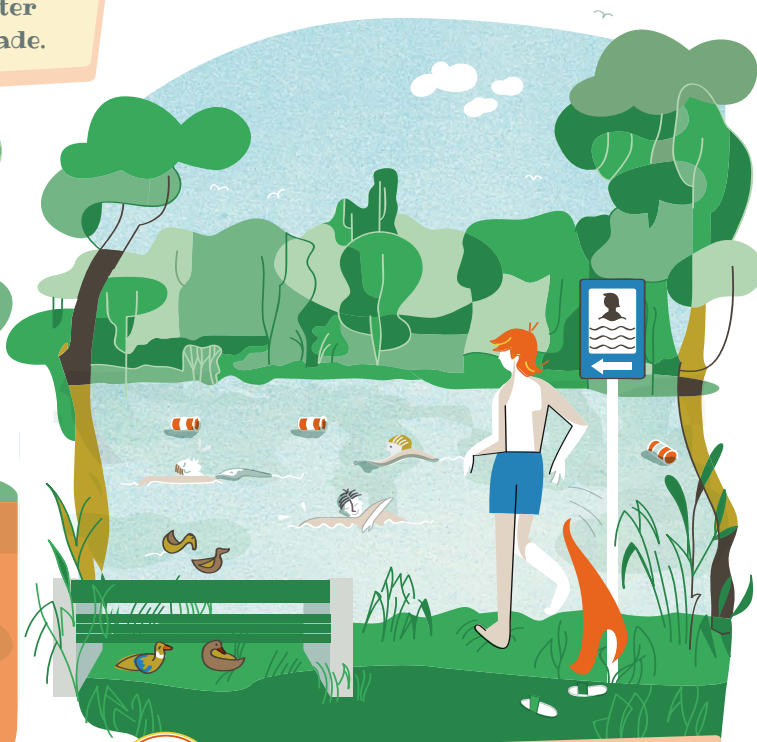

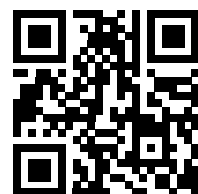

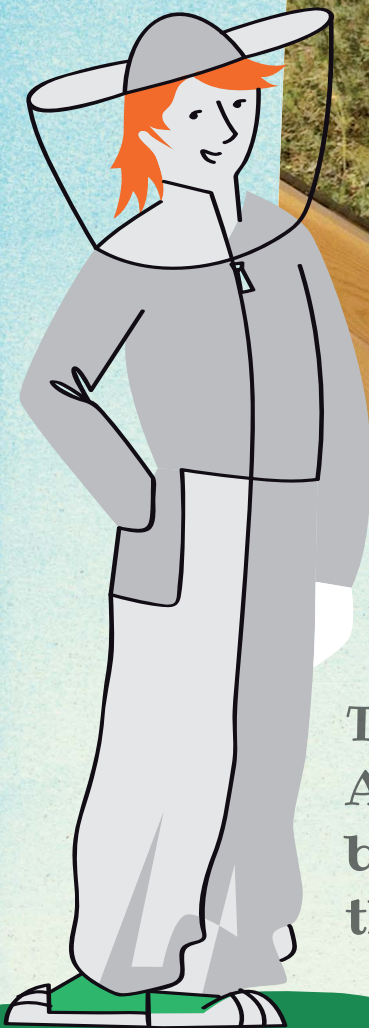

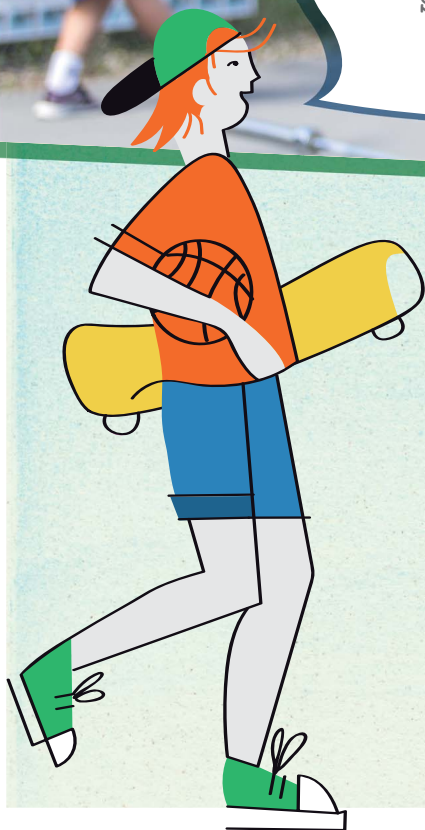


Since the creation

a traffic park for kids.

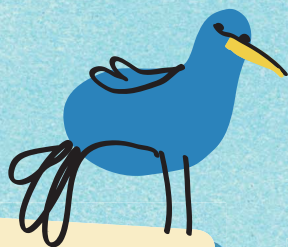


Reconstructed Barátság Park

petanque for the elderly.

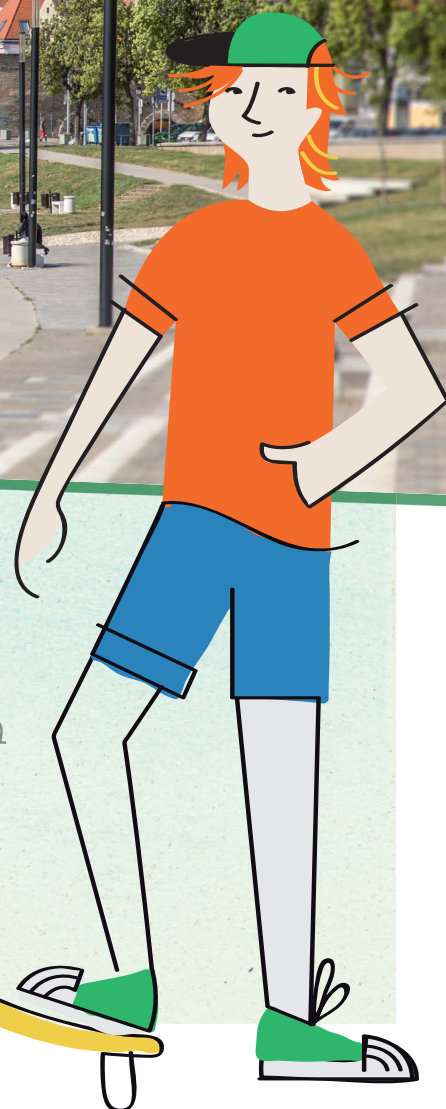


Moson Danube Complex Project

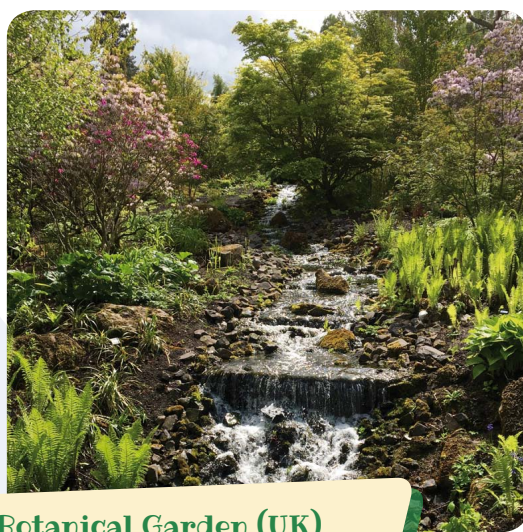
You can meet with the CityTree project in several European cities. This unique installation (similar to a green bench) is like a miniature forest which helps to keep the city air clean – and as a bonus, you can rest on it.



Hammarby Sjöstad (Sweden)



This 'town around a lake' is the first eco city district in Stockholm. Here, you can find not only large parks and other green spaces, but the whole district was designed in a way that allows inhabitants to feel as close to nature as possible.



Royal Botanical Garden (UK)

One of the UK's Royal Gardens established in Edinburgh. The garden not only hosts around 3000 exotic and domestic plants, but also tries to find solutions to climate change related city problems.

Bosco Vertical (Milan, Italy)



The two residential towers host 900 trees and over 20,000 plants from a wide range of shrubs and floral plants, all of which are distributed according to the sun exposure of the facade.

Jardim das Oliveiras (Portugal)



Porto's largest green roof, an oasis of 50 olive trees and lush grass on top of a semi-open gallery of shops, restaurants, and cafés. This is an urban park escape for city workers, tourists, and university students.

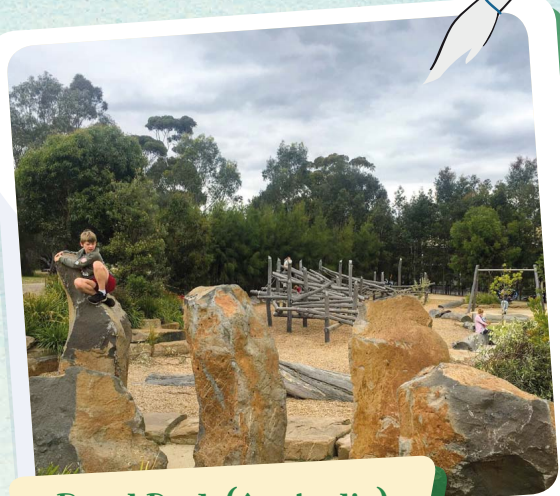

Parco Portobello (Italy)



This large park in Milan provides great recreational opportunities for all, from children's playgrounds to gaming areas for the elderly, as well as trails for biking, running and hiking. The park also has different gardens with a variety of vegetation.

Royal Park (Australia)



Royal Park is the largest of Melbourne's inner-city parks. Many sport and recreational facilities are provided here, and the park is home to many native animals, with a rich variety of birdlife.
